Please note, due to this taking place in a live public show ground you will need to arrive before the show exhibitor gates close, and will not be able to leave until the show has finished. Also please be aware of pedestrians and other vehicle and non vehicle movements around the Autotest arena and the show fields. Please arrive and depart the venue in a quiet, controlled and respectful manner. Anyone failing to do so risks being excluded from the event without a refund. With this in mind, please be friendly and willing to talk to anyone, as this may promote the event and encourage an interest in motorsport. 1 Announcement

2 Jurisdiction and Authorisation

The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of Motorsport UK., (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Supplementary Regulations

Motorsport UK Clubmans Permit Number: 131992

3 Entrants

The event is open to all fully elected members of the organising club, members of the following Clubs: Launceston & North Cornwall MC, Newquay AC, Truro & District MC, Plymouth MC, Camel Vale MC, Holsworthy MC, North Devon MC, Windwhistle MC, MG Car Club, and Woolbridge MC.

4 Payment

The entry fee is £20 per driver. Cars can be double driven. Please enter using the online form on the club website <u>www.shmc.co.uk</u>.

Entries will be accepted on a first come first served basis and entries accepted upon receipt of a completed entry form and full payment of the entry fee. Once the event has reached the maximum number of accepted entries, any entries made after this number will be placed on a reserve list in order of acceptance. Should a space become available the next available reserve will be offered the space. Any reserve entries not given an entry will be refunded in full.

5 Eligibility

Competitors require a valid Club membership card and Motorsport UK RS Clubmans Licence (as a minimum) which will be inspected at signing-on. Passengers are not permitted. The minimum age of a competitor is 16 years of age.

Any competitor (or marshal) under the age of 18 requires Parental Consent as defined by Motorsport UK includes completing the appropriate forms and the requirement to have an authorised adult present at the venue.

6 The entry list opens on publication of these SRs. The maximum entry for the meeting is 25, the minimum is 10.. Entries are accepted at the organiser's discretion. Entries close at 8 pm on Wednesday 26th July 2023.

An entry fee will be refunded if notice of withdrawal is given in writing prior to the closing date. Any refunds after the closing date will be at the discretion of the organising club subject to an administration charge.

8 Tyres:

Must be Road pattern only – Tyres which are classified as M&S, "knobblies", "grippers" or tyres marked "for competition use only" are <u>NOT</u> permitted. This is to preserve the venue.

9 Programme

The programme of the meeting will be:Scrutineering from09:00 hrsFirst car starts at09:30 hrsAny-competitor not signed on by 09:15 hrs may be excluded

10 Classes:

- The event will consist of classes as follows;
- A: Series Production Saloon Cars up to 1400cc
- B: Series Production Saloon Cars 1401cc to 2000cc
- C: Series Production Saloon Cars over 2000cc
- D: Series Production Saloon Cars (open and fixed roof)
- E: Specialist Sports Cars, Kit Cars suitable for road use and other cars ineligible for classes A-D.
- □ A petrol engine with forced induction will have its capacity x 1.7
- \Box A rotary engine vehicle will have their capacity x 1.5
- □ A non-forced induction Diesel car will have its capacity x 0.7

In all instances the "new" capacity will define which class they are in.

Classes may be amalgamated or sub-divided at the organiser's discretion.

- **11** Any driver who does not hold a full RTA Licence may only drive a Touring Car i.e. Series Production Car as defined in the Motorsport UK Year Book 2023 with a maximum engine capacity of 1400cc. Forced induction is not permitted.
- 12 Details of tests and any final instructions will be issued/available at signing on/documentation. Drivers will be allowed three runs at each test, (and must undertake a minimum of two runs per test). Two of these runs of which will count towards results. There will be 5 tests. The layout of each test will be available on the day. The running order for competitors will be available on the day. The course will be defined by a series of cones which might be less than 1 metre in height. Competitors will be allocated a competition number which may be supplied by SHMC on the day. Competitors will be given the opportunity to walk the course prior to competing Timing will be by marshal's app. Following the verbal instruction of the marshal, timing starts when the front wheels pass the start line.

A spill kit will be at the venue supplied by SHMC. There is no requirement for each car to comply with J5.10.13

13 Penalties

Wrong test / maximum score per round is: the slowest time in running class plus 20 secs

To finish a test the car must have come to a complete stop with all four wheels astride the finish line. The time continues to run until the car is fully stopped astride the finish line. You may reverse to comply with being astride provided this is done safely. Hitting a cone / marker has a penalty of an additional 5 secs per cone/marker to your time.

Cars must not be excessively noisy and comply with J.5.1.7. Should a car deemed to become too noisy during the event then they will be required to retire and no longer able to compete unless the situation is resolved.

14 Awards

The awards will be presented as follows:

Class win -
2nd in Class -
3rd in Class -
First lady -An Award & replica
an award subject to 3 starters in class
an award subject to 5 starters in class
an award subject to 9 starters in class
an award

Classes with fewer than 3 starters may be amalgamated at the Clerks of the Course discretion. No Competitor may win more than one award.

15 As the event takes place wholly on private property, vehicles need not be taxed or registered unless driven to and from the site.

- **16** Results will be published in accordance with D26.1.3 (i.e. 7 days) although preliminary results may be available after the event concludes
- **17** Any protest must be made in accordance with the Motorsport UK Yearbook 2023 Section C and accompanied by the appropriate fee.
